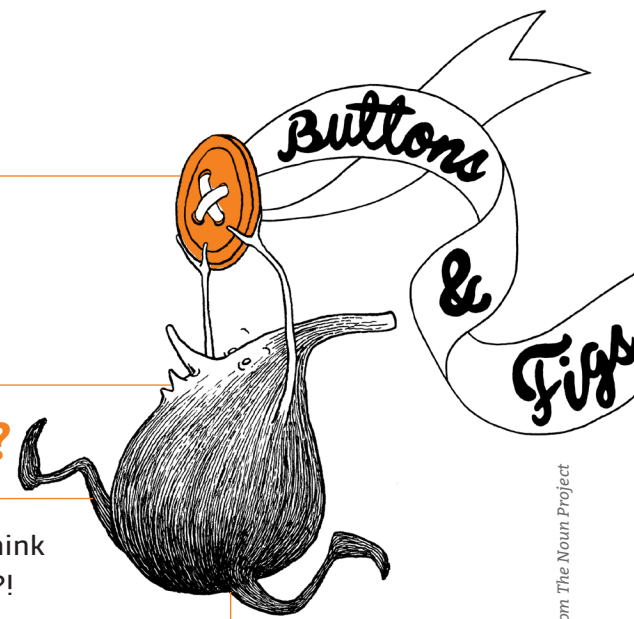

we’ll splook you away!”

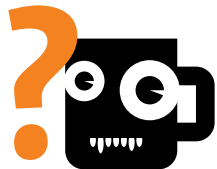

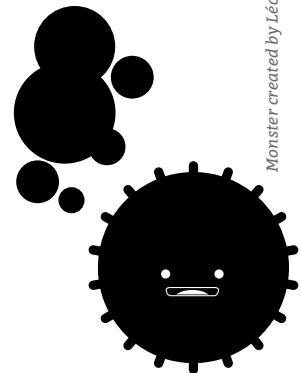
